1 Principal's Update

• Traffic concerns and update

There have been a variety of safety concerns that make it unsafe for our crossing guards. These issues include vehicles driving over cones near cross walks, vehicles driving too fast and failing to stop at cross walks, and bicycles not stopping at cross walks. Teachers and students have expressed concern with their safety. So GME administration has decided to discontinue the crossing guard program over the winter. The program may be continued again in spring if we can ensure the safety of our crossing guards. A BIG reminder to all parents to please obey parking signs around GME, to use the Kiss and Drop lane as a drop off only rather than a parking spot, to save handicap parking for those who need it, and to use caution when approaching cross walks.
