1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

5. <u>GUEST SPEAKER</u>

6. **PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE** | Brady Ibbetson, GME Principal

Principal Ibbetson welcomed both the returning and new PAC members. He reviewed the staff changes for the year, and shared the plans for the school's discretionary budget. Mr. Ibbetson discussed the district's theme for the school year, "Wonder," as well as the "Leader in Me" program that GME will be continuing this year.

7. PAC FINANCIAL UPDATES | L-J Winslade, PAC Treasurer

7.1 Opening Financial Position

The bank statements for August were presented to verify the opening financial position for the year. At the end of the 2023 fiscal year, the GME PAC had \$29,089.34, with \$9000.34 of that balance earmarked for playground enhancements.

7.3 Draft Budget 2023-24

Ms. Tesche explained the budgeting process. Each year, the school is asked to submit requests for funding to the PAC. The PAC focuses on funding school requests that have school-wide or broad benefits, rather than specific classroom requests. They try to make sure funding goes to support active living, the arts, science and technology. School requests are collected at the end of September and submitted to the PAC. The PAC Executive hold a budget meeting in mid-October to review requests and draft budget. The draft budget is then brought to the October PAC meeting for review and a vote.

9. <u>COPAC (Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council) Items</u>

9.1 Feedback Requested on SD23 Policy

After discussion, it was agreed the PAC will support the COPAC in requesting that SD23 refrain from barring SD23 staff members from serving on the Executive of school PACs in the district. While GME PAC recognizes that this would be best practice, they also acknowledge that some smaller schools may not have operational PACs if this policy were adopted, which would deny them access to the BC Gaming Grant funding for their schools.

10. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

10.1 State of the School Yard and Irrigation Repairs

The poor conditions of the school yard was discussed and it was noted that a recent Facebook post had sprung up, with community members and parents complaining about the disrepair. Ms. Tesche had raised both the Facebook post and the state of the yard at the September CO-PAC meeting, which had SD23 Chairperson Tiede and Superintendent Kardaal in attendance. Mr. Kardaal noted that their current focus was still on emergency operations as some areas of the district were still dealing with the fallout of the recent wildfires. The GME PAC discussed that while the wildfires would justifiably be the main focus of SD23 at the moment, the irrigation system has been broken for two years, long before the wildfires. Parents noted the safety concerns, for both the rocks and bare ground during the warm months, and the muddy and icy field it becomes in the winter. There was broad support for a letter writing campaign and suggestions of engaging the media. Ms. Tesche suggested that the PAC get some advice on next steps from PACs whose schools have needed similar work and volunteered to reach out and put together an action plan for review at the next meeting.

11. <u>PAC 360</u>

The PAC briefly discussed some upcoming events. It was noted that several parents have requested some sort of celebration of diversity and culture, as well as the return of the book swap. The requests would be considered at the Executive budget meeting, at which time both the financial and volunteer requirements of the 2023-34 events would be assessed.
