
4. PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE | Brady Ibbetson, GME Principal

Last Wednesday, October 22, Bankhead, Glenmore, and A.S. Matheson Elementaries partnered to host Dan Duncan, as he presented "Understanding and Responding to ADHD in Children." It was a great turn out and a successful event.

The winter concert for grades K-2 will be the week before Winter Break - exact date to be announced at a later date.

The UBCO Mobile Outreach Program has been booked for June 15-June 19, 2026. All K-6 classes will experience this excellent biology program in the gym.

Volleyball is running for grade 5 students, coached by Mme. Marques and Ms. Mahan and for grade 6 students, coached by Mr. Mac, Mr. Gazel, and Mr. Hatley.



5. PAC FINANCIAL UPDATES | Kellie Garcia, PAC Treasurer

PAC financial statements are available upon request.

Every year Brady puts a call out to teachers for requested items or experiences (aside from field trips) that the PAC could fund, this year we were able to fund \$17,770 of their requests. Teacher expenses are reimbursed to teachers by Sherri at the GME office, funds taken out of the PAC school account. Discussion about specific requests are as follows:

One of the requests came from Mr Ibbetson, which was the seacan located on school property, near Tronson Road. The seacan will be used to hold outdoor play equipment. Last year the pac had given funding toward a shed but the district didn't approve the shed because it would not be movable and could easily be broken into. The final decision was the seacan, which was approved by the district. The PAC has approved the request to cover the cost for it. Mr Ibbetson is considering having the exterior of the seacan painted with an outdoor scene.

The cloth library book bags that students in grades K-3 use to transport their library books back and forth from school are normally funded through the school's library budget. The request to have the expense of bags for the entering kindergarten classes and any new students covered by the PAC has been requested and approved. We are considering making this a standing budget item for the PAC going forward. If we carry the expense of paying for the bags then the Librarian, Mme. Marcil will have more budget to purchase books for the library. Students in grades 4-6 do not have to use the cloth library bags.

Jenna has a contact who has written children's books and has already presented at schools in the district. Directed to talk to Mme. Marcil to have approved.

Field trip requests are redirected to the field trip funds, not teacher requests funds.

Question about the artist who did art with the students that could then be ordered as cards. Brady usually books this artist every other year, since it was done last year she will be booked for next year.

For fundraising the PAC has decided to focus on the One-and-Done fundraiser. One-and-Done funds go into the PAC's School Account. Treasurer works with Sherry to balance numbers and Treasurer tracks the funds.



Spending more on PAC promotion and Website to encourage attendance and use of the website.

For the grade 6 celebration we are not contributing money this year because they have left over funds from last year.

Popcorn Machine - do we sell it or keep it? Rhonda loves it, has more kids at GME, and is willing to put the time into maintaining and using it.

The PAC is considering using the Grizzly Care funds to put together Christmas hampers for families in need and bumping up if there are more families in need. Considering how to support families in this way, while keeping confidentiality. Should the PAC do hampers for GME families and encourage classrooms to connect with Salvation Army or other community services to create their own hampers? There was not a conclusion to this discussion.

Question if the gaming account could be used to cover the cost of team jerseys for volleyball and basketball teams. Brady replied that they switched to t-shirts so the kids can keep them at the end of the season.

Questions about the balance, how far forward can you carry the balance. Gaming Fund is applied to each year and allows the PAC to receive \$20 per student each year. That money specifically has to be spent in 2 years and kept in a separate account. All other money that the PAC has can legally be held for as long as the members decide.

Over the last 5-6 years we ended up with a surplus of funds because of previous efforts to save for a replace the playgrounds and because of the impact time away from school due to COVID had on our ability to spend. The playground replacement was not approved by the district and those funds were moved into general spending. We are hoping to only carry forward \$8,500 into the 2026-2027 school year.

Why are we running a deficit budget - because the affordability grant will cover the cost of field trips so the PAC will carry forward with this budget and at year end will not be in a deficit.


9.2 Back up Grade 6 Babysitters for PAC Meetings
